

MUST SEAS QUICK GETAWAY ITINERARY

Who doesn't love a weekend getaway? Norfolk, Virginia is a quick ride from Richmond and D.C., and we've got a bunch of activities to fill up your Saturdays and Sundays. Below you will find the best and most iconic things to do in Norfolk for your quick weekend away.



HERMITAGE MUSEUM AND GARDENS

The Hermitage Museum and Gardens, free to the public, consists of an early 20thcentury historic house museum with a worldwide art collection and contemporary exhibition galleries, surrounded by twelve acres of formal gardens and natural woodlands; educational wetlands; and a Visual Arts School.



GLASS LIGHT HOTEL AND GALLERY

The Glass Light Hotel and Gallery is a beautiful representation of our city's love for glass art and history. The hotel is situated in a centuryold building dating back to 1912 and the gallery is made up of 65 small and life-sized pieces of glass art which has free admission and is open to the public.



NORFOLK TIDES

Attend a baseball game and cheer on the Norfolk Tides, Norfolk's minor league baseball team in the Triple-A International League. As an affiliate team of the Baltimore Orioles, the Norfolk Tides play at Harbor Park on the Elizabeth River in Downtown Norfolk.



EXPLORE THE ELIZABETH RIVER TRAIL

This 10.5-mile urban biking and pedestrian trail runs adjacent to Downtown and is a great way to see Norfolk from a different view. Bike, walk or jog along the waterfront through Norfolk's neighborhoods where you can pick up food to go or a local craft beer.



CHRYSLER MUSEUM OF ART AND PERRY GLASS STUDIO

The Chrysler Museum of Art is a cultural enclave that includes 30,000+ original works of art that span more than 5,000 years in its galleries. The Perry Glass Studio is where you can witness professional glassblowers creating masterpieces through free demonstrations or make a piece of glass art yourself at one of their classes.



NORFOLK BOTANICAL GARDEN

The Norfolk Botanical Garden is nationally recognized for its deep-rooted history and celebrated for its blooms in every season. The 175-acre garden is home to 52 distinctive themed gardens, 95 species of birds and 30 kinds of butterflies.



EAT AND DRINK

Filled with a vibrant mix of chefs, farmers, bakers, and seafood, Norfolk has blossomed into one of the South's most dynamic foodie destinations. From fresh interpretations of traditional favorites to more adventurous modern fare, Norfolk serves it all.



MERMAID WINERY

Mermaid Winery is Virginia's first urban winery and has free tastings every Friday. Their menu includes 14 of their own varietals, along with 800 wines sourced from around the globe.
